The world famous Trent Bridge Cricket Ground in Nottingham will host One Day International matches between England and Sri Lanka in June and England and Pakistan in August

Location

Trent Bridge Cricket Ground, the world's third oldest Test Cricket venue is located to the south of Nottingham City Centre, just over 1 mile from the rail station. This iconic ground is well placed on the banks of the River Trent in West Bridgford and easily accessible by all modes of transport if you're travelling locally or from further afield.

Arriving on foot

If you live locally then walking to the event is the healthiest and cheapest way to get there. If you're not sure of the best route try www.walkit.com select 'Nottingham' from the drop down menu and type 'Trent Bridge Cricket Ground' into the destination box.

Cycling to the ground

Trent Bridge is well placed on Nottingham's cycle network. For details on routes please see our online map at www.nottinghamcity.gov.uk/cycling. For the best route visit www.cyclestreets.net and enter your journey details. You can hire a Citycard Cycle for £1 for 24 hours from any hire point around the city. (see map overleaf). Visit www.citycardnottingham.co.uk/cycle.html to find out more. Cycle parking locations are within close proximity to the ground, and are shown on the map opposite.

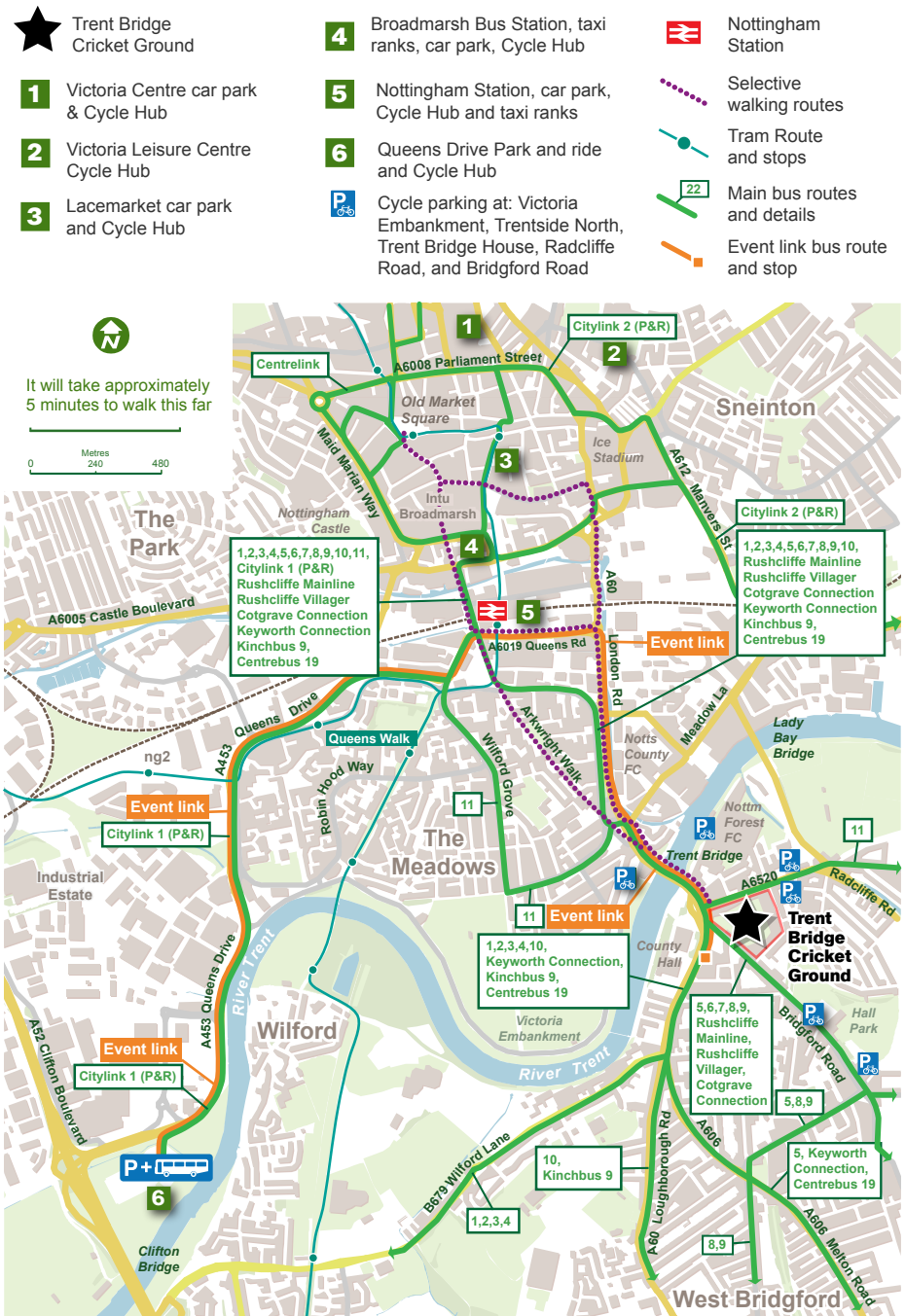
Arriving by bus or tram

The closest tram stop to Trent Bridge is the Queens Walk stop; this is located around a 20 minute walk to the ground. NET is running a £2 return ticket for all match and season ticket holders. There are many buses that connect the city centre to Trent Bridge Cricket Ground via Nottingham rail station and from the city. The most frequent services operate every few minutes from Monday to Saturday. Look out for the Nottingham City Transport buses 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11. The Trent Barton services Rushcliffe Mainline, Rushcliffe Villager, Cotgrave Connection and the Keyworth Connection will also get you there along with the Kinchbus 9 and the Centrebus 19. The map overleaf shows the locations of all Trent Bridge bound bus stops.

You can buy a Robin Hood day ticket on all bus services passing the Cricket Ground for £4.50. For more information please visit www.robinhoodnetwork.co.uk.

All ticketholders can enjoy a discounted Eventrider ticket for routes within Greater Nottingham in collaboration with Nottingham City Transport (NCT). Arriving by train

Train timetable and ticketing information can be found at www.nationalrail.co.uk. Nottingham Train Station is around a 20 minute walk from Trent Bridge.

Driving to Trent Bridge

There are a number of well located, secure car parks around the city centre. The maps show the locations of the most suitable within walking distance of Trent Bridge. If you have a spare seat in your car or looking for a ride then why not visit www.nottinghamshare.com the free to use car share website that could save you money on your transport costs.

Using the Park and Ride (P&R)

If you are travelling from further afield then using one of the many tram, train or bus based P&R sites might be the best option. Queens Drive is the closest P&R site to Trent Bridge Cricket Ground and there will be a special Eventlink Park & Ride service which will operate for the One-Day Internationals. Eventlink is a direct bus service run by NCT which operates approximately every 10 minutes, costing just £5.00 per car for up to a maximum of 4 people (with a £1 surcharge for over 4 people). Buses only drop off and pick up outside Sandcliffe Ford on Loughborough Road (around 100 yards from Trent Bridge).
