



ENGLAND AT TRENT BRIDGE

1st Vitality International T20 v Pakistan Friday 16th July 2021



The world famous Trent Bridge Cricket Ground in Nottingham will host the first Vitality International T20 - England v Pakistan Friday 16th July 2021 at 6.30pm

Arriving by bus or tram

The most convenient tram stops for Trent Bridge are Nottingham Station and Meadows Embankment - both a 20-minute walk away. Spectators travelling by car can take advantage of seven free Park & Ride sites across the city. The closest to the ground is Clifton South (17-minutes tram travel time) stopping at Meadows Embankment, which is a 20-minute walk along the river or through The Meadows to Trent Bridge. Or travellers can stay on-board and get off at Nottingham Station. As an added incentive to use the tram, Nottingham Express Transit (NET) is offering a £2.50 return Event Ticket for all match and season ticket holders. Please purchase the £2.50 Event Ticket at any of the tram stop ticket machines and have it to hand, along with your match ticket, should it be requested by a travel officer. If you have any problems purchasing the ticket, please use the help point provided on the side of the ticket machine.

There are many buses that connect the city centre to Trent Bridge Cricket Ground via Nottingham Station and from the city. The most frequent services operate every few minutes from Monday to Saturday. Look out for the Nottingham City Transport buses 1,3,5,6,7,8,9,10 and 11, which stop in the city centre and outside the station.

NCT offer a Grouprider ticket for £6, which can be used by up to five people, where there has to be at least one adult (19 and over), and no more than two adults. Grouprider can be purchased through the NCTX Buses app, as well as on the bus using cash. Adult tickets can be bought using contactless payment on the bus.

The Trent Barton services Mainline, Rushcliffe Villager, The Cotgrave and The Keyworth, will also get you there, along with the Kinchbus 9, the Centrebus 19 and the Marshalls 90.


You can buy a Robin Hood day ticket on all bus services passing the Cricket Ground for £5.10. This ticket also includes tram services. For more information visit www.robinhoodnetwork.co.uk

Audio and visual announcements inside all buses will inform you exactly where to get off.

Driving to Trent Bridge

Using the Park and Ride (P+R)


If you are travelling from further afield then using one of the seven tram P+R sites might be the best option.
